CITIZENS' CONCERNS:

Chief Administrator Robinson announced that the Board received a letter from the Legislature regarding a 39 million dollar budget cut on Williamson Act Subventions in various counties and its potential effect on Land Use policies.

Planning Director Robson informed the committee that he had received the 2002 edition of "Growing Smart" Legislative Guidebook from American Planning Association. He noted the two chapters (User Manual Chapters 7 & 8) that were given to the members and explained how the guidebook would be a benefit to the Committee.

Chief Administrator Robinson said that each member will receive a CD copy of the Growing Smart Legislative Guidebook by the next meeting on July 11, 2002.

Anne Read requested that the minutes be placed on the agenda for approval. Chief Administrator Robinson said that each member would be sent copies of the minutes from the past meetings for review and approval at the next meeting on July 11, 2002.

Chief Administrator Robinson announced that the Board of Supervisors approved the General Plan Economic Development Element and that each member would receive a copy at the next meeting on July 11, 2002.


Planning Director Robson reviewed areas in the County for Community meetings. The members of the Committee suggested these areas for Community meetings: Rancho Tehama, Dibble Creek, Dairyville(Lassen View), Woodson Bridge area, Proberta/Gerber, El Camino, Mineral/Paynes Creek, Richfield, Manton, Coming, Capay, Bowman, Lake California, Bend, Reeds Creek/Red Bank, Red Bluff, Antelope, Paskenta/Flournoy, Los Molinos and Vina.

The members were divided into two groups and they discussed changes they felt were necessary for Objective sections of Agricultural Lands and Timber listed in the Resources Group of the General Plan.

Chief Administrator Robinson said the group that is working on the Agricultural Lands would continue with this section at the next meeting on July 11, 2002. He then said after the group finishes the section, the members would be divided into three groups and they will continue with discussions until the sections in the Resources Group have been reviewed.

Bill Burrows distributed a handbook "Vitalsigns" to the members that were present.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned 8:35 p.m.
